

As the main point, however, is the greatest profit, it is interesting to note that the acre value of the products were respectively \$62.86 when sown broadcast and the first crop was cut for hay, \$55.00 when sown broadcast and the first crop was cut for seed, \$51.18 when sown in drills twelve inches apart, and \$43.60 when sown in drills twentyfour inches apart. The rather high value of the first crop of hay, \$21.13, even after costs of making t are deducted, gives the advantiges to the first method.

According to this experiment he most profitable way would be to sow broadcast and cut the first erop for hay. However, for a district like that around Cap Rouge where the season is short, it should e remembered that the first cuting should be made around the niddle of June, for if it is delayed
