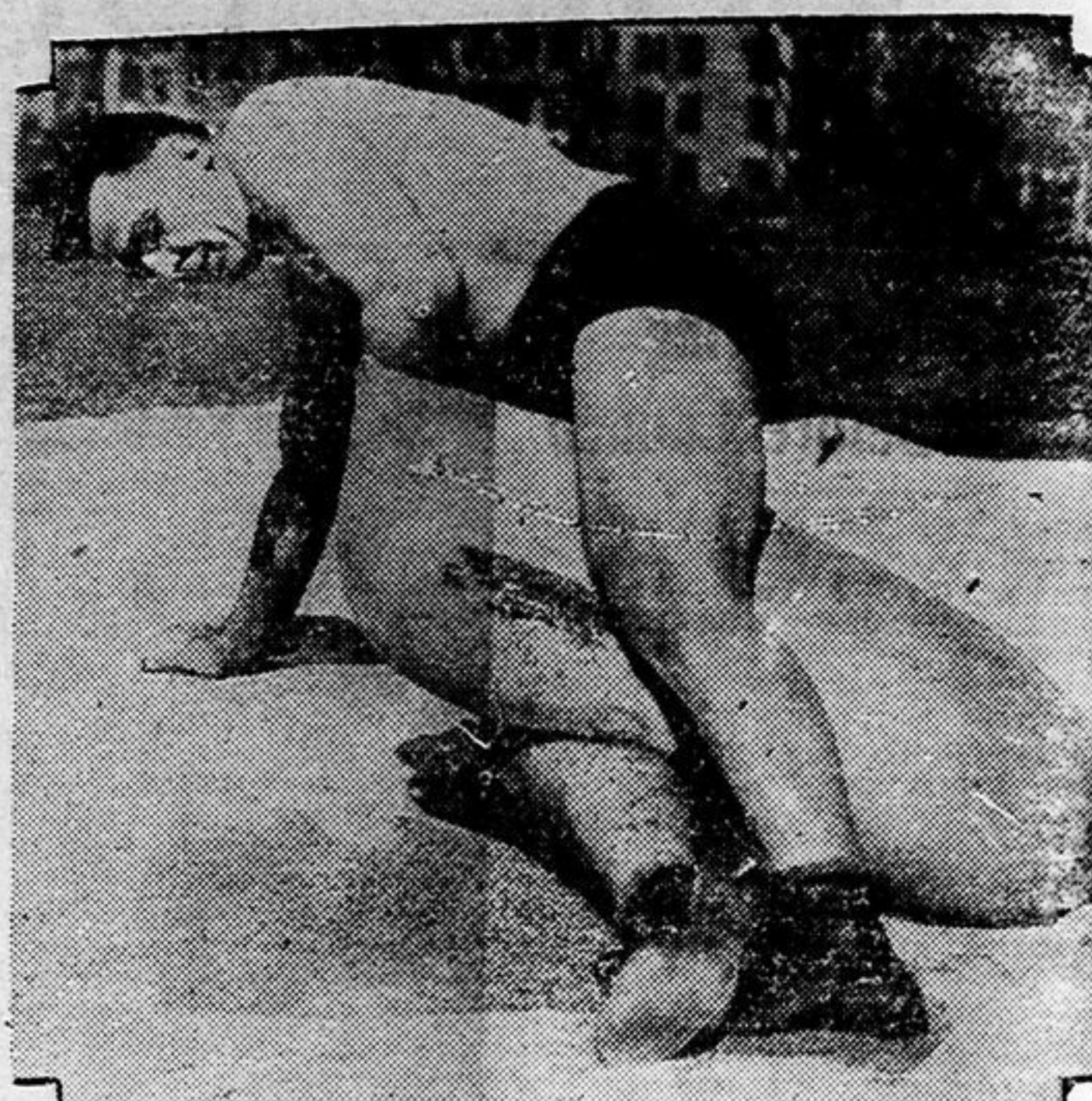
Honour with Profit
