Council met June 23. Members all present. Minutes adopted.

H. McEachern—Philip: That the report of the Road Superintendent for work on roads be adopted.—Carried.

The Treasurer reported the receipt of \$130.00 from John D. Ross re purchase of sideroad lots 15, 16, Concession 5 as per agreement, also \$1.00 from Oscar Lewis for tree, also \$25.00 from J. W. Wilkinson for used lumber at Iles bridge and \$124.36 for surplus cement sold.

N. McEachern—H. McEachern: That for the purpose of getting a more equitable basis for distribution of the road money we classify all roads and sideroads as follows: Class A to consist of all concessions and base lines; class B to consist of two sideroads between concessions having heaviest traffic; Class C to consist of balance of roads and D all sideroads open for traffic; Class D all sideroads not open for traffic.

The comparative being Class A 5 per cent, Class B 2 1/2 per cent, Class C 1 per cent and Class D 0.—Carried.

H. McEachern—Philip: That the bulk tender of J. McKinnon, Paisley, for the construction of the bridge known as Drury's, opposite lot 13, concessions 5 and 6 for the sum of \$7,939.50 be accepted.—Carried.
