Why Lacrosse Has Declined in Canada

The recent visit of an American lacrosse team accompanied by reports of the tremendous stride the game is making in the United States college circles as led to a lot of moralizing as to the decline of lacrosse in its own Canadian home...

Lacrosse, on the other hand, requires equipment costing something like \$18 per player and grounds that are not easily available as well as undivided application.
