KRAKATAO ISLAND HAS VANISHED IN SEA

Volcano Action Blamed—Wave After Eruption in 1883 Took 36,000 Lives. The island of Anak Krakatau, or translated into English, child of Krakatau, which had a height of 170 feet, disappeared beneath the surface of the sea during the intense activity of near-by Krakatau on August 8th, which is throwing out fountains of fire.

At some remote period a large volcano rose in the centre of the tract where the Sunda Strait now runs. An explosion blew the mountain away and its base was left as a broken ring of islands.

In 1690 a great eruption, accompanied by earthquakes and the ejection of large quantities of pumice, occurred. About 1877, other eruptions occurred and there were followed in 1883 by a tremendous subterranean commotion, which began on August 26 and lasted until August 28.

It also caused world-wide disturbance of the atmosphere and a succession of sea waves that did much damage to shipping and other property, took the lives of 36,000 human beings and travelled thousands of miles from the centre of propagation.

Krakatau, the island which has disappeared beneath the sea, was uninhabited. "RIGMAROLE" WAS A GAME In the early Middle Ages there was a game called "Ragman", which was a sort of lucky dip, the players pulling a string whose other end, concealed, was attached to a present.

BIRDS AS BAROMETERS ARE VERY SENSITIVE

Most birds are notoriously sensitive to approaching changes in the weather and a lot of useful information can be gained by watching their habits, says an English writer.

Rooks, particularly, enjoy a well-deserved reputation as prophets. The holiday-maker needs no surer indication of coming rain than the sight of rooks wheeling and swooping earthward during a flight.

The shrill notes of the blackbird, the call of the finch, and the chirping of the sparrows, all indicate the possibility of showers.

The miscal thrush, sometimes known as the storm cock, sends out a warning in no uncertain manner when storms and gales are coming.

The call of the cuckoo heard on the uplands is a sure precursor of fine weather, and no sound is more welcome to the would-be picnicker than the lark's song heard far overhead.

Chickens are not quite so noisy and are generally to be noticed indulging in a dust bath just before rain sets in.

SOMETHING TO MAKE

You can make a pretty holder for the string ball out of a square box. A tin box is good for the purpose, but if you have no tin box a cardboard one will do nicely.

You can decorate your string box by covering it with brightly colored paper. Red or orange is particularly attractive. Next, paste on the side of the box a picture of a black cat or kitten.

NOTICE

TO OWNERS AND OPERATORS OF MOTOR VEHICLES

FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITY LAW

A New Measure for Safety on the Highways in effect SEPTEMBER 1st, 1930

THE amendment to The Highway Traffic Act, known as the "Financial Responsibility Law," will come into effect on September 1.

PURPOSE of the LAW

The purpose of the Financial Responsibility Law is to further encourage safe driving of motor vehicles, in the interest of the public as well as of owners and drivers.

WHAT the LAW will ACCOMPLISH

No motorist is affected by this Law until he brings himself within its provisions. It will not impose any obligation upon those who drive safely and obey The Highway Traffic Act, and who, in case of accident, pay judgments rendered against them for injury done to persons or property.

HOW the LAW will OPERATE

Upon conviction of an operator of a motor vehicle for any one of the offences named below, his driver's license and all motor vehicle permits issued to him will be suspended until such operator or owner gives proof of his ability to compensate financially those whom he may endanger in the future.

The OFFENCES

Following are the offences named:

- (a) reckless driving, if any injury to person or property occurs in connection therewith. (b) racing on the highways, which is prohibited by The Highway Traffic Act. (c) exceeding the speed limit, if any injury to any person or property occurs in connection therewith. (d) failing to remain at or return to the scene of an accident and to furnish the names and addresses of driver and owner of vehicle and failing to render all possible assistance, if directly or indirectly a party to the accident. (e) driving a motor vehicle on a highway without holding a driver's license. (f) any criminal offence involving the use of a motor vehicle, including driving a motor vehicle while intoxicated. (g) any offence against public safety on highways as may be designated by the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council.

NON-PAYMENT of JUDGMENTS

If the holder of a driver's license or owner's permit fails to satisfy a judgment rendered against him for damages on account of injury to, or death of, any person, or on account of damage to property in excess of \$100, occasioned by a motor vehicle, within 15 days from date of judgment, such license or permit shall be suspended until such judgment is satisfied to the extent of at least \$5,000 for injury to, or death of, any one person and, subject to that limit, for each person so injured or killed to the extent of at least \$10,000 for injury to, or death of, two or more persons in any one accident, and to the extent of at least \$1,000 for damage to property of others resulting from any one accident, and until such person gives proof of his financial responsibility in case of future accident.

OFFENCES OUTSIDE ONTARIO

By Drivers Licensed in this Province For similar offences committed in other Provinces or States of the United States and reported to the Registrar of Motor Vehicles of Ontario under reciprocal arrangements, the Minister of Highways shall suspend the driver's license and owner's permit until that driver or owner has given proof of financial responsibility in the same manner as if the offence had been committed in Ontario.

PROOF of FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITY

Amounts and How to Give Proof of financial responsibility shall be given in the following amounts by every driver and in the case of an owner in the same amounts for each motor vehicle registered in his name:—

- (a) at least \$5,000 for injury to, or death of, any one person and, subject to that limit for each person so injured or killed, at least \$10,000 for injury or death of two or more persons in any one accident. (b) At least \$1,000 for damage to property of others resulting from any one accident.

Proof of financial responsibility may be given in any one of the following forms:

- (a) The written certificate filed with the Registrar of Motor Vehicles of any authorized insurer that it has issued to the person named a motor vehicle liability policy or policies which at the date of the certificate is in full force and effect. (b) The bond of a guarantee insurance or surety company licensed in Ontario, or a bond with personal sureties approved as adequate. (c) The certificate of the Treasurer of the Province that the person named has deposited with him a sum of money or securities for money approved by him to the amount or value of \$11,000 for each motor vehicle registered in the name of such person.

PUBLIC NOW PROTECTED by INCONTESTABLE INSURANCE

In the event of damage being done by the owner or driver of a motor vehicle to another person or to property of another person, and such owner or driver holds an insurance policy to pay the legal liability of the insured for such damage, and if through misrepresentation upon the application for such policy or in the event of a breach by the insured of any term, provision or condition of the policy which would relieve the insurer from liability, the insurance company must nevertheless under the Safety Responsibility Law, pay the damage to the person injured up to the limits named above, but in such case the insurance company by a provision in their policy may have the right to recover from the person insured the amount or amounts so paid in liquidation of the damages for the injury he has done to the persons or property of others, including interest and costs.

REPORTING of ACCIDENTS

Every person in charge of a motor vehicle who is directly or indirectly involved in an accident, if the accident results in personal injury or in damage to property apparently exceeding \$50, shall report such accident forthwith to the nearest provincial or municipal police officer and shall furnish such information or written statement concerning the accident as may be required by the officer or by the Registrar of Motor Vehicles.
