Plan Your Program

Now is the time to plan next winter's feeding program, not next winter. At this time, farmers can estimate whether they will be short of hay...

Seed corn, this year, it not only reasonable in price, but is of exceedingly high quality. A few extra tons of high protein hay, and a well-filled silo, will be of considerable assistance in reducing the feed bill next winter.

Better Farm Practices

In spite of the depression and the shortage of ready cash farmers everywhere in Ontario are using this year more careful and thorough farm practices than ever before.

Seed merchants report that they have never had such a demand for high class seeds. All available supplies of alfalfa, alsike, red clover, wheat, barley, oats, buckwheat and peas have been purchased and sown on Ontario farms.

These facts all indicate that the average farmer is not only taking advantage of low prices but is doing his part toward meeting depressed prices. He is doing everything possible to increase his yield per acre and thus lower the production costs which enables him in some degree at least to successfully meet the present low prices.

Weekly Crop Report

Heavy rains have assured ample moisture in practically every part of Ontario. Crops are looking splendid. Fall wheat, clover and alfalfa are making excellent growth.

New Advisory Board

Hon. Thomas L. Kennedy, Minister of Agriculture, has announced the appointment of a five-man Advisory Board under the chairmanship of D. O. Bull of Brampton to assist the Department in matters pertaining to the live stock industry of the province.

The ten per cent. tariff which went into effect March 1st, 1932, on foreign plums entering the United Kingdom, in the opinion of Andrew Fulton, fruit growers' representative in Britain, offers a splendid opportunity to the Ontario plum industry to develop this potential export outlet.

Battling the Weeds

Through a series of Annual Meetings, one in each County, more than 1000 Weed Inspectors in Ontario were brought together along with Reeves and Road Superintendents.

Weed inspectors reported Sow Thistle to be the worst weed on cultivated land with Twitch Grass a close second. Both these weeds are now found in every county. Some counties reported Sow Thistle to be spreading while others maintained it is decreasing.

START RECORDS BUREAU OF FARM ORGANIZATIONS

A Central Bureau of Records of Farmers' Business Organizations is being established in Ottawa by the Economics Branch of the Dominion Department of Agriculture. The immediate aim of the Branch is to build up a statistical record of the number and location of such organizations, to ascertain the number of farmers marketing their products co-operatively and to obtain reliable information on the volume of business handled in this way.

This survey of farmers' organizations covers the whole of the Dominion of Canada. For a number of years the Department of Labor has collected and published information concerning the activities of co-operative organizations. By mutual agreement the Economics Branch is now the collecting agency. The Provincial Governments are also co-operating in this work in various ways in order that duplication of effort may be minimized.

With these records as a basis for study the Branch will be in a position to make an analysis of the organization and financial structure of the various co-operatives which will be available to those interested in their development.

The Branch will thus provide a directory and will become a consulting agency for farmers' business organizations.

Due to the anxiety of the average farmer to secure the highest possible yield per acre this year, Mr. J. A. Carroll, chief of Weed Administration in Ontario, predicts marked progress in Weed Control during the growing season of 1932.

Wellington County is alfalfa conscious. R. H. Clemens, the Agricultural Representative, says that 12,000 acres in that County were seeded to alfalfa this spring. One merchant alone sold over 200 bags.
