

An enterprising Sydney, N.S.W., newspaper, in order to convey to its readers the magnitude of the huge new Harbour Bridge recently constructed at the Australian port, printed the composite picture shown above for the enlightenment of its readers.

Thrilled by descriptive stories of the new Canadian Pacific liner "Empress of Britain" that appeared in Australian papers when that giant liner was sped on its maiden voyage last year by H.R.H. the Prince of Wales, Australians have taken as prideful an interest in the "Empress of Britain" as Canadians, and the picture, labelled "Empire Achievements" paid tribute to the enterprise of the Dominion and the Commonwealth.
