Collect Apple Data.

W. J. Fairweather and W. S. Rowe, O. A. C. experts, began recently the collection of cost and income data from apple growers in Norfolk County.

When the data have been obtained the agricultural economics branch will analyze it systematically and reports be made to individual farmers before the final report is complete.

Encouragement for Boys

In the beef cattle judging competition the boy making the highest score will receive a calf; the boy making the highest score in judging of dairy cattle will receive a calf also; a sow will be given to the boy making the best score in the judging of hogs; the highest standing boy will likewise receive a ewe lamb in the sheep judging contest; the high standing boy will have his choice of a calf, hog or lamb.

Ontario Packers' Gesture Is Step In Right Direction

"In the production of better quality products, the farmer requires the same incentive as those engaged in other lines of business, namely price," said J. A. Carroll, secretary, Ontario Marketing Board.

"The most effective educational work for the improvement of quality is done, in my opinion, at the market-place. Handlers of farm products can do much toward improving quality, if they will buy according to grade."

Ontario and the Grain Show

Ontario will be well represented at the World's Grain Show in Regina, July 24 to August 5, 1933, stated Hon. Thos. L. Kennedy, Minister of Agriculture, at a meeting of the Ontario Committee recently.

GAME SEASON

The National Park Service of the Interior, Ottawa, has just issued the regulations regarding the Migratory Birds for the current year.

A summary of the regulations as they apply to Ontario follows—

Open Seasons

Ducks, geese, brant, rails, Coots and Wilson's or Jack Snipe—in that part of Ontario lying north and west of the French and Mattawa Rivers and also including all Georgian Bay waters; September 1 to December 15.

In that portion of Ontario lying south of the French and Mattawa Rivers (but not including any part of the Georgian Bay waters)—September 15th to December 15th.

Elder Ducks—North of the Quebec Cochrane, Winnipeg line of the Canadian National Railways; September 1 to December 15th.

Woodcock—September 15th to November 30th.

Closed Seasons

There is a closed season throughout the year on Wood Ducks, Swans, Cranes, Curlew, Willets, Godwits, Upland Plover, Black Bellied and Golden Plover, Greater and Lesser Yellow Legs, Avocets, Dowitchers, Knots, Oyster-Catchers, Phalaropes, Stilts, Surf-birds, Turnstones and all Shore birds not provided with an open season in above schedule.

There is a closed season throughout the year on the following non-game birds.

Auks, Auklets, Bitterns, Fulmars, Gannets, Grebes, Guillemots, Gulls, Herons, Jaegers, Loons, Murres, Petrels, Puffins, Shearwaters and Tern.

There is a closed season throughout the year on the following insectivorous birds—Bobolinks, Catbirds, Chickadee, Cuckoos, Flickers, Fly-Catchers, Grosbeaks, Hummingbirds, Kinglets, Martins, Meadowlarks, Nighthawks, or Bull bats, Nuthatches, Orioles, Robins, Shrikes, Swallows, Swifts, Tanagers, Thrushes, Vireos, Waxwings, Whippoorwills, Woodpeckers, Wrens, and all other perching birds which feed entirely or chiefly on insects.

No person shall kill, hunt, capture, injure, take or molest any migratory game birds during the closed season and no person shall sell, expose for sale, offer for sale, or transport any migratory game bird during any time

The taking of nests, or eggs of migratory game, migratory insectivorous and migratory non-game birds is prohibited.

The killing, hunting, capturing, taking or molesting of migratory, insectivorous and migratory non-game birds, their nests or eggs is prohibited. The possession of migratory game birds killed during the open season is allowed in Ontario until March 31 following open season.

Coots and Gallinules 25 in the aggregate, Wilson's or Jack-snipe 25, Woodcock 8, and not more than 125 Woodcock or 150 Ducks in the season.

Guns and Appliances The use of automatic (auto loading) swivel, or machine guns, or battery or any gun larger than number 10 gauge is prohibited and the use of any aeroplane, power boat, sailboat, wounded live birds as decoys, night lights, and shooting from any horse drawn or motor vehicle is forbidden.

The shooting of migratory game birds earlier than sunrise and later than sunset is prohibited.

The penalty for violation of the Migratory Bird laws is a fine of not more than three hundred dollars and not less than ten dollars, or imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months, or both fine and imprisonment.
