BRANDED BEEF IS POPULAR

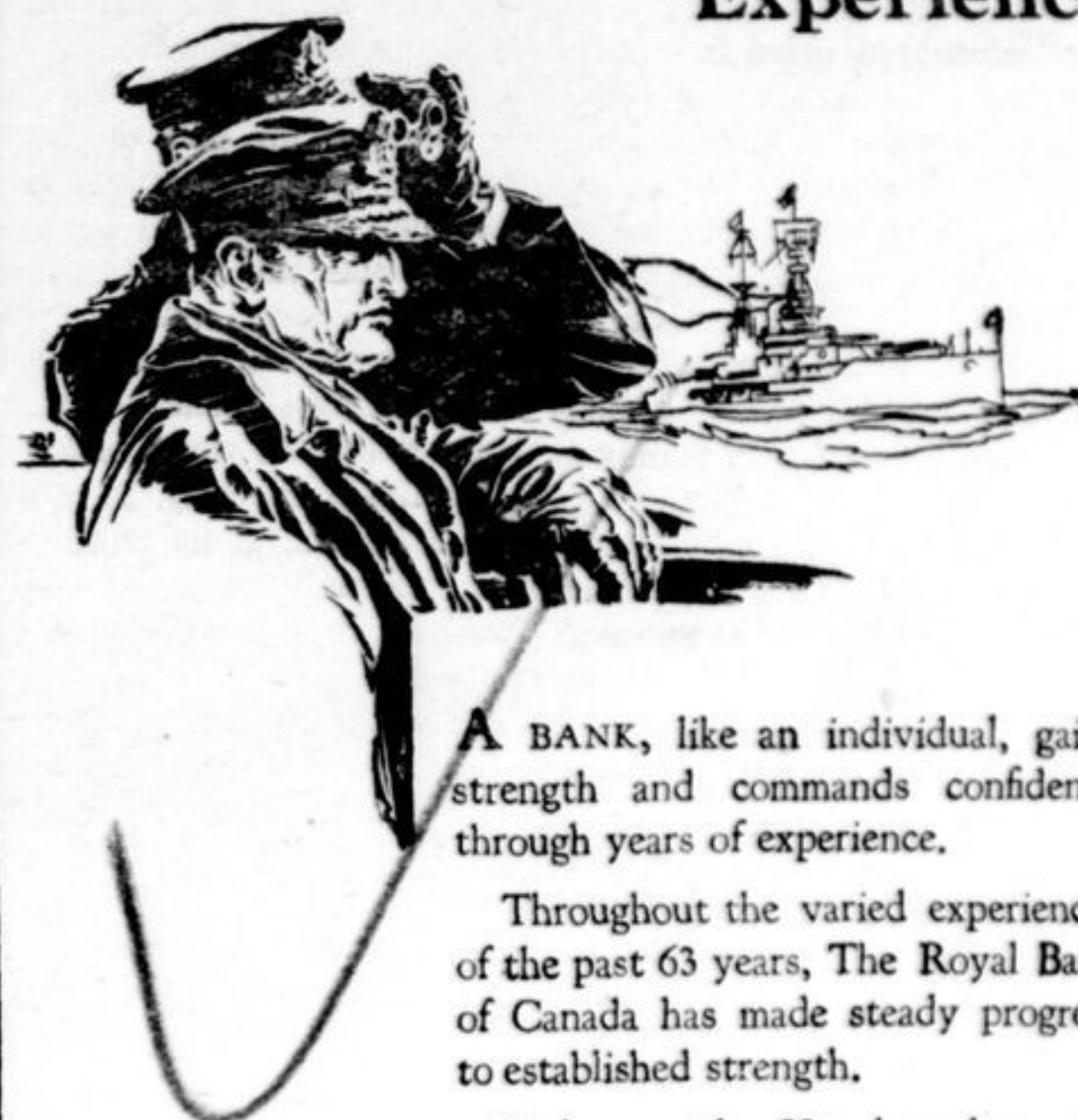
The annual report of the Minister of Agriculture for Canada for the fiscal year ended March 31, 1932, contains the following reference with respect to officially branded beef.

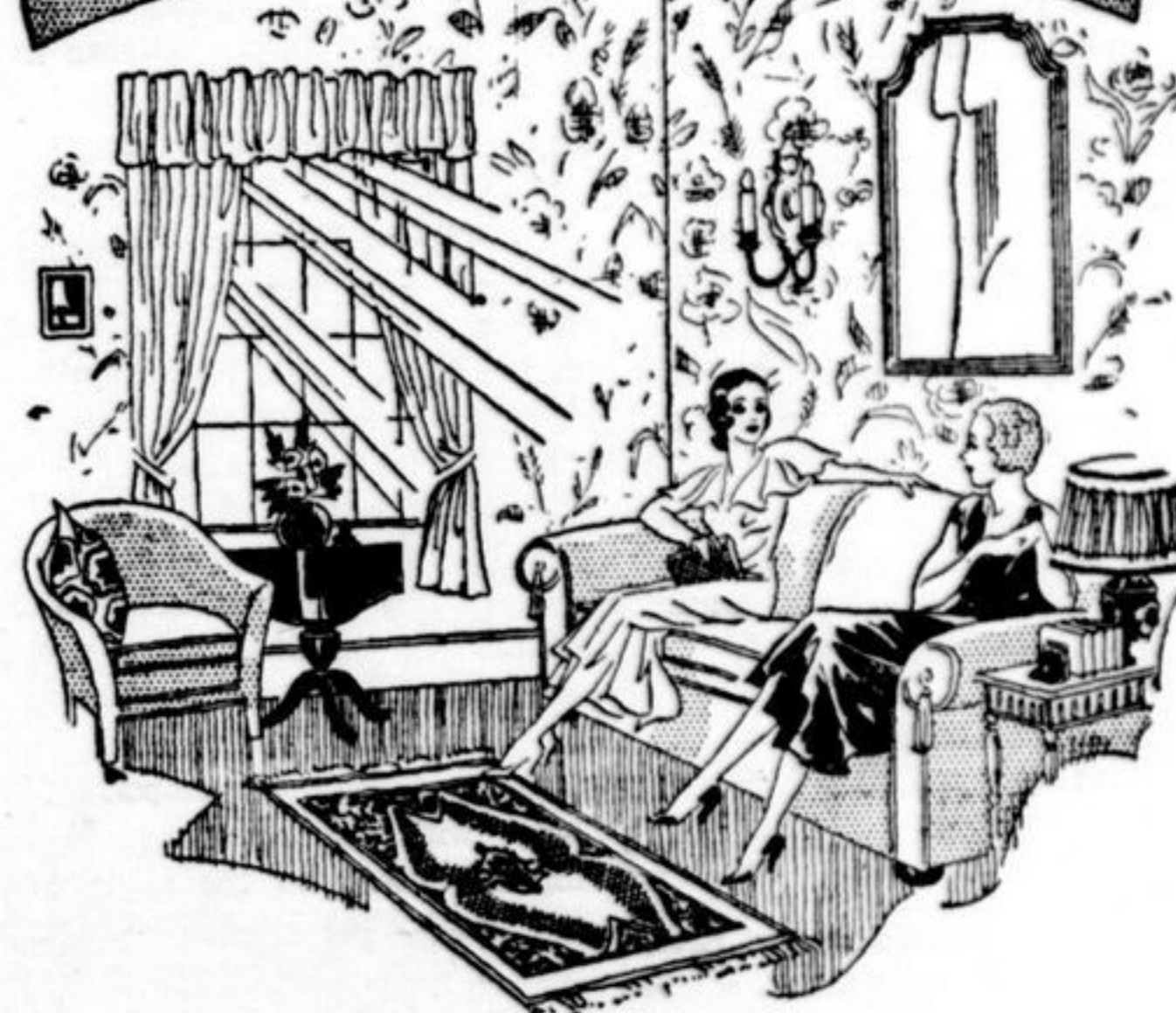
