Driver Receives Suspension, Fine

Keith Waples, one of Canada's top harness racing drivers, has been fined \$1,000 and suspended for 30 days by the Ontario Racing Commission.

The suspension was announced Thursday after a hearing to investigate a positive drug test reported on trotter, Lotta Bomb, winner of the eighth race at Garden City Raceway in St. Catharines September 3.

The track judges suspended Waples when the test showed the presence of a drug in the nature of procaine or one of its derivatives.

Waples was not driving Lotta Bomb Sept. 9. He was in Batavia Downs driving in the New York Sire Stakes and his nephew, Ron Waples, handled Lotta Bomb.

But under the trainer responsibility rule, Keith Waples is responsible for the mare even though he was not at the track. He was listed on the program as the trainer of Lotta Bomb.

Testimony at the hearing showed Lotta Bomb has been injected with Aximycin, an antibiotic penicillin which contains procaine. The drug is not a stimulant, but the commission ruled that Waples was responsible even though there was no evidence of deliberate drugging.

The suspension reverts to September 14. None of the horses owned by Waples will be allowed to race until the suspension ends. All horses in his care must be transferred to his nephew.

The suspension also means Waples will have to withdraw from numerous stakes including the rich \$50,000 Sheppard Pace in New York Saturday. He was to drive Penn Hanover, rated second choice.

Among Waples' personal goals, he was the first driver in Canada to rein a horse to a mile victory in under two minutes. He did it with Mighty Dudley at Montreal's Richelieu Park in 1959.

Dressmaking Course Offered

The leaders attending Training School will, in turn, teach this course to a group of ladies in their own community. All participating will attend a Summary Day to be held at the conclusion of the project.
