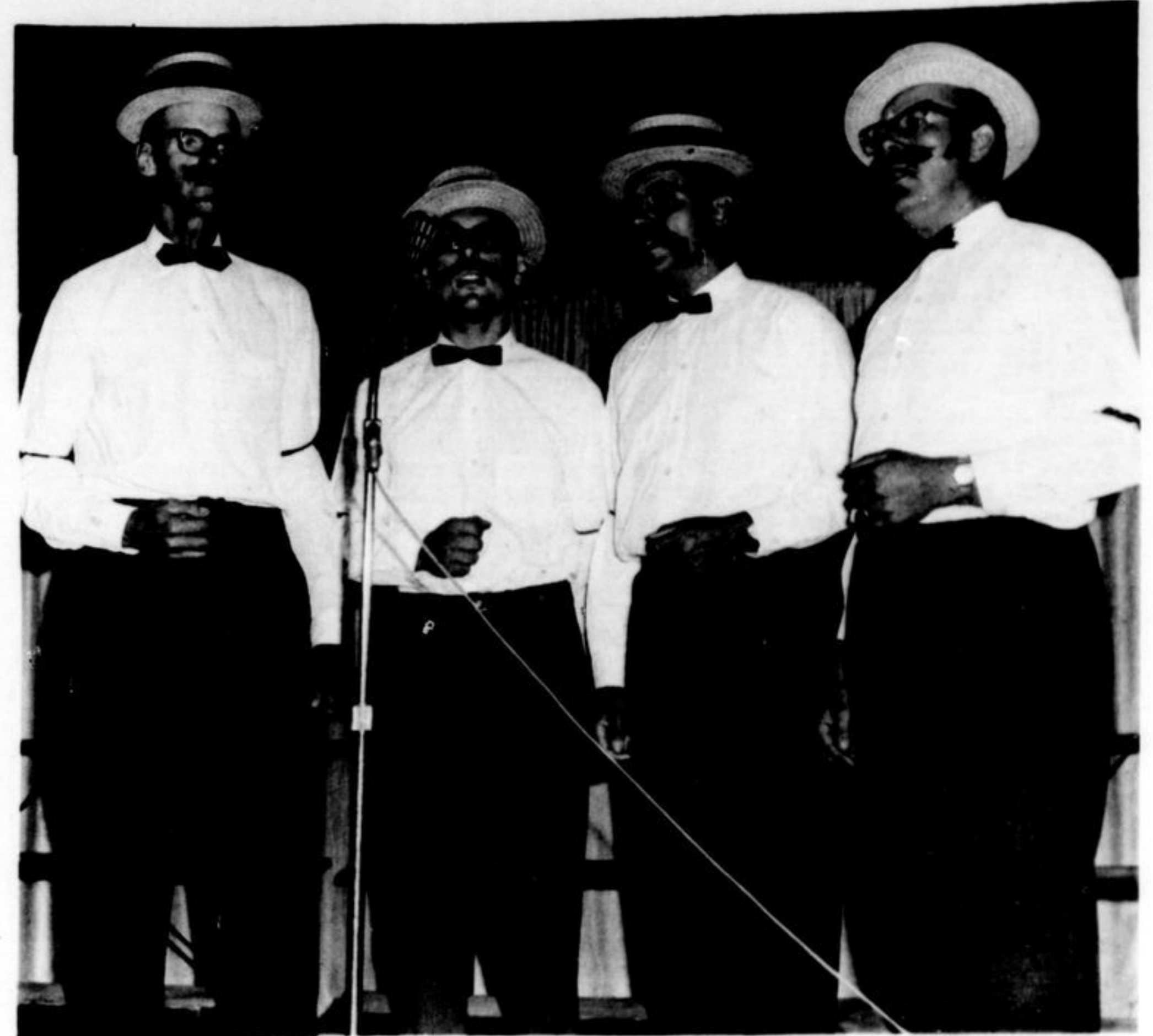
Miss Ann Jackson was winner of third place in the Queen contest sponsored by the Credit Union on Friday evening at the Durham Fall Fair.
