## Protection For Angling Waters Proposed By GBDA

Study should be given to the order of priority in which community services are strengthened in Thornbury, while in Shallow Lake, Flesherton, Dundalk, Grand Valley, and Shelburne a comprehensive review is required because of their substantial needs in terms of housing

stock, basic services, and other elements of the community fabric.

In Grey and Dufferin, as in Bruce and Simcoe, more intensive and careful development of renewable resources is needed. Forests should be upgraded. Attention should be given to acquiring those portions of the Niagara Escarpment not already utilized for agriculture or ski developments, as well as key shoreline areas.

Angling resources must be protected as an important part of the zone's tourist attractions. By purchasing fishing streams or acquiring easements on them the bad effects of unwise dam building and removal of forest cover can be prevented. Unfortunately, the best reaches of too many streams are denied to the public.

The Rocky Saugeen still supports Southern Ontario's finest speckled trout but is threatened by numerous dams which destroy the natural habitat for fish. Unless the province takes steps to protect the fishing waters that now course through private land, the only angling available to the public will be in a few conservation areas.

"Experience in the past indicates that the Ontario Government lacks an efficient, sophisticated land buying machine that can compete with the private sector in parkland acquisition," the brief maintains. "Private developers and speculators are assembling prime recreational areas that will be needed in the future for public use."
