Dear Sir:

I have read in your column where you explained that we must have flares in our trucks. Would you please advise me, when I am required to use them.

Dear Constable:

Is there any law stating how many feet I must keep between my car and another on the highway? I have heard the law is 20 feet for every 10 miles per hour. Is this right?

ANSWER:

Section 89, Subsection 8 of the Highway Traffic Act states: "When any commercial motor vehicle or trailer is disabled during the period when lighted lamps are required to be displayed on vehicles and the vehicle cannot immediately be removed from the roadway outside a city, town or village, the driver or other person in charge of the vehicle shall cause such flares, lamps or lanterns to be lighted, and shall cause them or

ANSWER:

Section 78, Subsection 1 of the Highway Traffic Act states: "The driver or operator of a motor vehicle shall not follow another vehicle more closely than is reasonable and prudent having due regard for the speed of such vehicle and the traffic on and the condition of the highway." The part about 20 feet for every 10 miles per hour is a good safety rule to follow.

With only three entries, all are winners for this month. We would like to see more interest. With the raising of the index eligible for premium from 103 to 105 so soon after the new grading system coming into effect has caused some concern to all producers. Coupled with this is the possibility that the premium may be cut off altogether in the near future. This comes at a time when producers are beginning to improve their grades and just after everybody had co-operated with the government in setting up this new grading system.

If you as a hog producer are interested in keeping this incentive bonus on hogs 103 or over on the index scale, you should sit down and write a letter to both your local members of parliament and to Mr H. A. Olson, Minister of Agriculture, House of Commons, Ottawa, Ontario.

The G.F.O. Campaign is now well underway in Grey County. All townships have their canvassers lined up and these people have attended workshops to fully acquaint themselves with the proposal. However, a petition bearing 15,000 signatures is urgently needed and all committeemen and township hog producer representatives are urged to give their support in helping obtain these names.

Those who sign the petition are merely asking for a chance to vote. They are not committing themselves to vote in favour of a G.F.O.
