of prevention. It is well known that typhoid fever is a water-borne disease, and is commonly taken into the system in drinking water which has become contaminated from the excreta of persons suffering from the disease. Freezing does not in any way impair the vitality of the bacillus of typhoid, so that ice from a river or pond may convey the disease to consumers hundreds of miles, perhaps, from the source of infection.

Milk has more than once been the means of conveying the disease. Fortunately most milk-dealers are aware of the necessity of cleanliness in the preparation of milk for shipment. In most modern dairies the bottles, before being filled, are subjected to the daughter, st cilizing effects of steam. It seems highly probable that the natural juices of the healthy stomach | are able to destroy many germs of GREAT HARDSHIP AND EXPOSdisease; but the number which any stomach may be able to digest, and thus render its owner sofe from attack, must always be uncertain, and it is not desirable to test its capacity in this direction.

The fact that only certain persons out of a number who have partaken of food or drink infected with diseasegerms may suffer is explainable on the ground of their different general physical condition, or of the varying states of their digestive organs.

Boiling or cooking in any form destroys all germ life; and feed or drink about which there is a question of typhoid infection should be subjected to one of these processes before it is taken into the stomach.
