The Pan-American Exhibition about which so much has been said and written is a task too big for us to undertake to describe...

Our first glimpse of the big show was at night, when the illuminations were all on, and the view of the hundreds of thousands of electric lamps...

The electric tower is certainly a marvel of beauty before which the spectator must feel a grand reverence for the achievements of his fellow beings...

Everything there is gotten up to take the eye (and we might say the money too) but with exception of the electric tower...

The following description of the tower, copied from a little guide book, will give an idea of the size of things. It says: While you are here (meaning the plaza) the ascent of the tower should be made...

The Stadium, 680 ft. by 450 feet, is of classical architecture and copied from the Stadium at Athens. It has a seating capacity for 12,000, and the sports and live stock exhibitions are held here...

The Canada building is quite near the stadium, and the sight of the Union Jack is an invitation to every lover of Canada to pay it a visit.

The Temple of Music, 150x150 feet, is a beautiful structure of Classical Renaissance Architecture. Height of dome 180 feet, cost \$85,000, seats 2200.

TO EDITOR OF DURHAM CHRONICLE, DEAR SIR:—It has been raining here every day for about two weeks, I am tired doing nothing so have decided to write a short letter to you and the readers of the Chronicle.

Prospects were very bright for the Manitoba farmer till the rain started, but now some of them feel very gloomy indeed. The majority of the people around here intend to stook-thresh and some of them have not staked at all.

This is a very pretty country around here and the crops are yielding very well; wheat will average over 25 and oats about 50.

I have never seen better crops of potatoes than are here this year. They are all free from scab and look like our new-land potatoes.

The weather has been beautiful up till the time this rain started, and it seems to be settled again to-day and we expect another month of fine weather.

I was glad to hear that your cement works are progressing so rapidly. There will be a great demand here for cement in the near future.

The Western farmers are erecting a large binder-twine factory in the city of Brandon this fall. The Company has \$100,000 capital taken by the farmers in \$20 shares...

Now I could tell you a great deal more about Manitoba but I know you will be able to get better material for your paper so I will close.

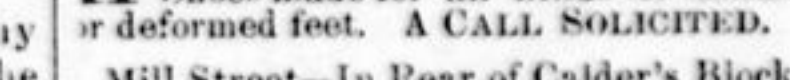

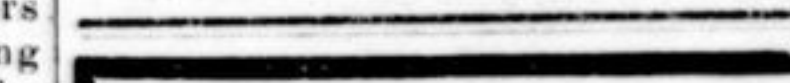
