It is very desirable that this movement for better pay should every where be extended to teachers Never have the schools of this coun try had so important a part to play in our civilization as at the present time, and nothing else is so important about the schools as the qualification and character of the teachers Monthly or yearly rates of payment of teachers that seemed ample 15 or 20 years ago are quite insufficient now. This is true with respect to the public schools, and it also applies to higher institutions, where the salaries of profession ought to be made sufficient to attract and hold a superior class of men. The problem is a very serious one and it deserves careful consideration throughout the country. If there is one reason stronger than another why the taxing of power should lay a firmer hand upon the growing wealth of great corporations and upon the income of vast private fortunes, it is because the state must adequately perform its responsible task of education, If there is to be compulsory attendance of schools, there must be schools worth attending, and ample provision for all the childern. If there is to be extention of child labor laws and better enforced exclusion of children from factories, mines, and various grinful employments there must be developed such a system of education as to add immensely to the efficiency of the child when at a later age be joins the breadwinners. Let us repeat then that central fact in the school system is the teacher, and we cannot expect to have the right sort of teachers in the long run without paying them enough to justify them in regarding their profession as permanent calling rather than a temporary makeshift .- From .
