In 1900 the boun ies paid amounted to \$1,017, and in 1906 to \$8,082. But it is suspected that some of this money should have been paid by Michigan. However, let us not blink the fact that wolves are on the increase in the North, that the opening of new settlements, the pushing of new railway lines through hitherto unvisited regions, brings the wolves into evidence and sets them ranging in new directions, and the safety of the game requires that they be thinned out.
