A Serious Charge

P., at Flesherton, who in Crown Attorney Armstrong. The latter instructed Mr. M. K Richardson, Ex-M. P., the special agent of the Children' Aid Society to lock into the matter and as a result of the information the Attorney General's department was communicated with and Provincial Detective Greer was sent up to make a thorough investi gation. On Saturday last he was in Owen Sound and consulted Mr Armstrong, and warrants were issued for Thompson's arrest.
