Top Cliff.

On this apparently beautiful frosty morning of Monday the 15th of April, we sit down for a while for the purpose of gathering some news of some kind for the Chronicle, as we have not contributed for some time. However, the Editor knows well the good and bad points in all his correspondence, and although Conservative we know that he is of a liberal turn of nature, consequently we look for forgiveness for neglect of duty in the past, and make good promises for the future.

Lots of frost and cold weather during the last couple of weeks. Not much Spring work done yet. Some are trying to plow while others are trying to do something else.

Railroaders are busy east and west of Priceville, but the weather is kind of unfavorable for the work so far in the season. As the railroad is running close to the public road down this line for about a quarter of a mile, it makes it bad travelling for teams in case of trains coming unawares. The Hopkins case is not settled, we understand, and by all appearance the public road will be close to the railroad. We can then go on our way rejoicing into Durham, for we can go up Peter Watson's hill to Upper Town and avoid all doings with the railway.
