ASH WIZARD'S SECRET HAS BEEN DISCOVERED.

No More Big Coal Bills For Happy Altoona—Whole Town Burning Ashes— and Saving Money—Moisten Them—With Solution of Alkaline Salt—Oxalic Acid Still Better.

The chemical action of this compound is thus explained:—When an aqueous solution of alkaline salt, such as common salt, is mixed with coal ash the result is that a mild lye is formed, which, when mixed with any combustible material, such as coal, and upon the application of heat, gives off oxygen gas, thus promoting rapid combustion.

The addition of oxalic acid causes a chemical change of greater value than the first, for the reason that the second chemical breakdown results in the formation of a carbide, which in turn gives off acetylene gas, this adding to the intensity of the heat and facilitating complete combustion.

It is possible upon moistening a small quantity of ashes, without the addition of coal to readily detect the odor of acetylene gas, and if the treated ashes are placed upon a lighted fire they will fuse and burn to a fine powder.
