PREVENTION OF SMOKE NUISANCE.

International Action May be Taken in the Matter.

Combined action by the Canadian and United States Governments for the prevention of the smoke nuisance is being sought by the International Association for Smoke Prevention.

At their convention in Milwaukee next month they will start a movement for a universal law for the two countries making the emission of smoke itself for any length of time illegal, and not forcing the State to prove a nuisance in each case.

Mr. Harris, Property Commissioner, who returned Saturday from Cleveland, states that the United States Government has appointed a commission to go over the country and study ways and means for smoke prevention. Special tests will be made during the Jamestown Exposition.

A LOW BIRTH RATE.

London, May 13.—The Registrar-General of Vital Statistics in England and Wales reports that in 1906 the births were 934,391. This is at the rate of 27 per 1,000 of the total population, the lowest hitherto recorded.
