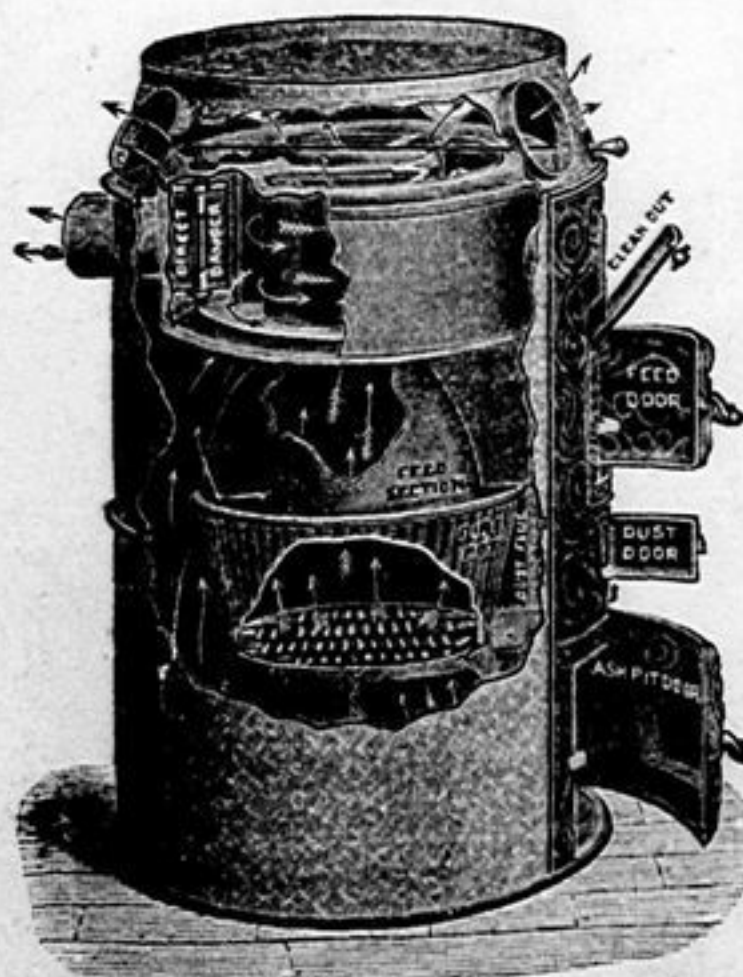
Notice of Dissolution of Partnership.
