cussion lately among the people of Brant as to who is responsible for the repair of the bridge on the 2nd Con., north of the Durham Road, which collapsed a couple of weeks ago owing On motion, made and seconded, the to the lowering of the water in the lakes. This chain of lakes presents an interesting study. There are half a dozen or more of them, the only connection between them being a little creek, which runs through all of them, and finally empties into the Saugeen a little to the south west of Hanover. The space between two of these lakes where the bridge was located is only a few rods wide, and the sinking of the bridge is supposed to be due to the fact that the creek had been deepened in order to draw more water off the lakes. This was done to expose a great marl surface, and as the marl is used up the creek will have to be further lowered. In-


