Weir—Hunt—That the report of the Reeve agent, the Priceville meeting re closing of part of the town line be accepted and that he be paid \$1.00 for his services.—Carried.

Black—Hunt—That the Reeve, Clerk, McMillan, Weir and Hunt be paid \$1.00 each for services at joint meeting with Artemesia at Priceville re closing of parts of townline G. and A.—Carried.
