#### POSTAL CHANGES.

The following important changes in the Imperial penny and foreign postal rates went into effect on the first of October: The postage on letters to Great Britain, Egypt and all parts of the British Empire, except Australia and Rhodesia, which has hitherto been 2 cents per ½ oz will be 2 cents per cz., Australia and Rhodesia not having signified their adhesion to the change, the rate on letters to these colonies will be, as hitherto, 2 cents per 1 oz. The postage on letters to Postal Union countries, with the exceptions above mentioned and United States and Mexico will be 5 cents for each letter one oz. or less. On letters weighing more than an oz the postage will be 5 cents for the first oz. and 3 cents for each subsequent oz. or fraction
