Dealers state that the great bulk of the importation from the Old Country, at any rate, was returned butter, the shippers finding they could make a larger profit with prices prevailing here than they could on the British market. There is a considerable consignment on the way to Canada now from Australia and New Zealand, and also from Ireland. Dealers state that butter can be brought from these countries and set down in Toronto and Montreal at 28 to 30 cents per pound.-Toronto


