RAISE HOTEL RATES WITHIN TWO MONTHS.

Hotelmen of Other Cities Take Action—London to Follow.

Hotel rates which were reported through a rumor yesterday to be on the point of an advance in London will not likely go up for some months. At the end of that time, however, there is a good likelihood that the traveller will have to pay more for his daily board.

One of the officials of the London Hotelmen's Association told the Free Press yesterday that he was opposed to raising the rates at present, because of the scarcity of money.

The fear apparently among the hotelmen is that the attempt to raise at the present time might result in failure and would effectively stop any future movements.

A meeting of the hotelmen of Western Ontario was held in Hamilton Thursday with representatives from London, and the sentiment of the meeting was that a raise should soon come. It was suggested for December 1, but this was opposed in other quarters. It was not denied locally that the rates would raise about fifty cents a day. The action will not be taken at once, however.

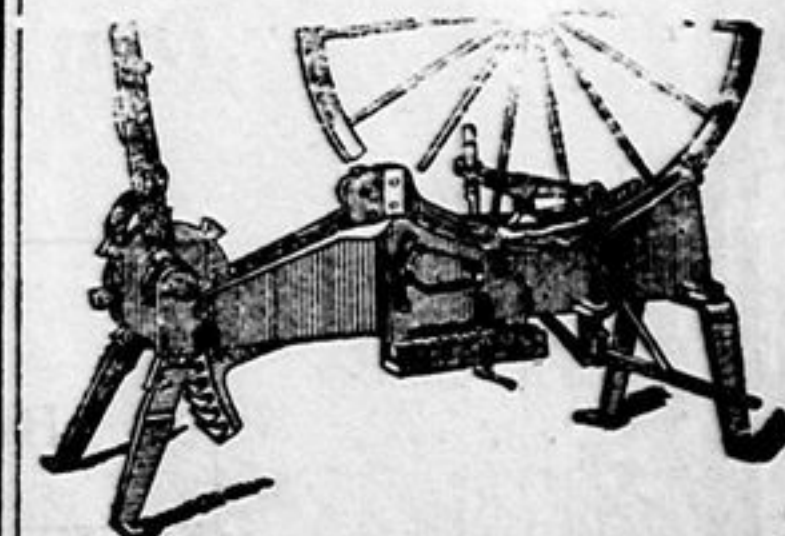
