We notice by an exchange that in Kincardine Model School the teachers 7-1806-tt men 3. What is true of Kincardine is the case of nearly every Model School in this Province, with this exception, that in the majority of cases the proportion of lady to sentlemen teachers is more than 5 to 1 In Normal Schools the lady teachers are having it nearly al their own way. The standing is:-Toronto. 185 lady and 5 men teachers; London 152 lady and 14 men teachers; Ottawa, 115 lady and 7 men teachers.

> To what this will eventually lead, thoughtful parents and students of chilo development do not like to think. It is not a question of the fitness of the lady teacher. Many of them are quite as capable and as well prepared as the best man teacher can possibly be; and most of them have a rare skill in the management of pupils, particularly of backward pupils and those who are in need of sympathy, which few men can rival. But that is not the whole question. The training of a boy requires the presence of a man's influence, and it is better that he should have the ex ample of a moderately well equipped man than of the best lady instructor who ever stood before a blackboard.

If we are going to turn our schools Normanby. This is a highly improved wholly over to the ladies. we shall farm in good locality. Anyone wishing to rob the rising generation of boys of an influence in the upbuilding of a character which cannot well be overestimated. In 1884, upon the death of the late A. W. Lauder, M. P. P. he contested the representation of East Grey in the Ontario house against Robert Myles of Euphrasia township and he succeeded in defeat ing his opponent by a majority of 622 votes which was a very decided victory.
