Just as rural free delivery of our mails brings us next door neighbors to the post office, so to speak, so would a good road shorten the distance to market. Of course, to spend all

the money building good roads connecting cities and large towns for pleasure driving would benefit only a few, as a great majority use the roads only for business purposes, and all their longdistance travelling is done by train. Yet those who run autos, motorcycles and other such de- Durham vices have a right to a fair share of consideration. But we would not agree to a specified kind of road for all parts, but to suit conditions. If the farmers make their case plain enough and strong enough they will get their share of the grant when it comes and it is time they were beginning to organize for the work, otherwise the pleasure-seekers may persuade the Government that their needs are all that are required. The delay through the Senate's objections is only temporary. They have not known anything done of late for the strengthening of the real prop and support of our country, and old chaps cannot be expected to change their ways for better ones as readily as younger men; but it is coming.
