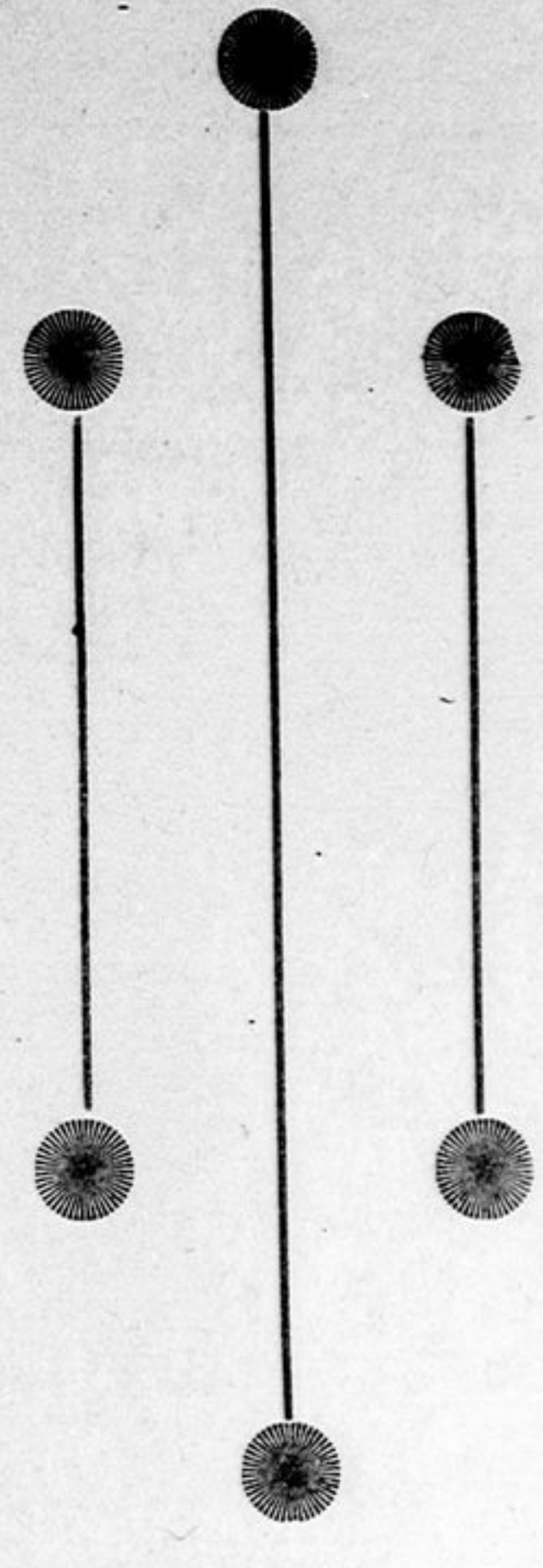
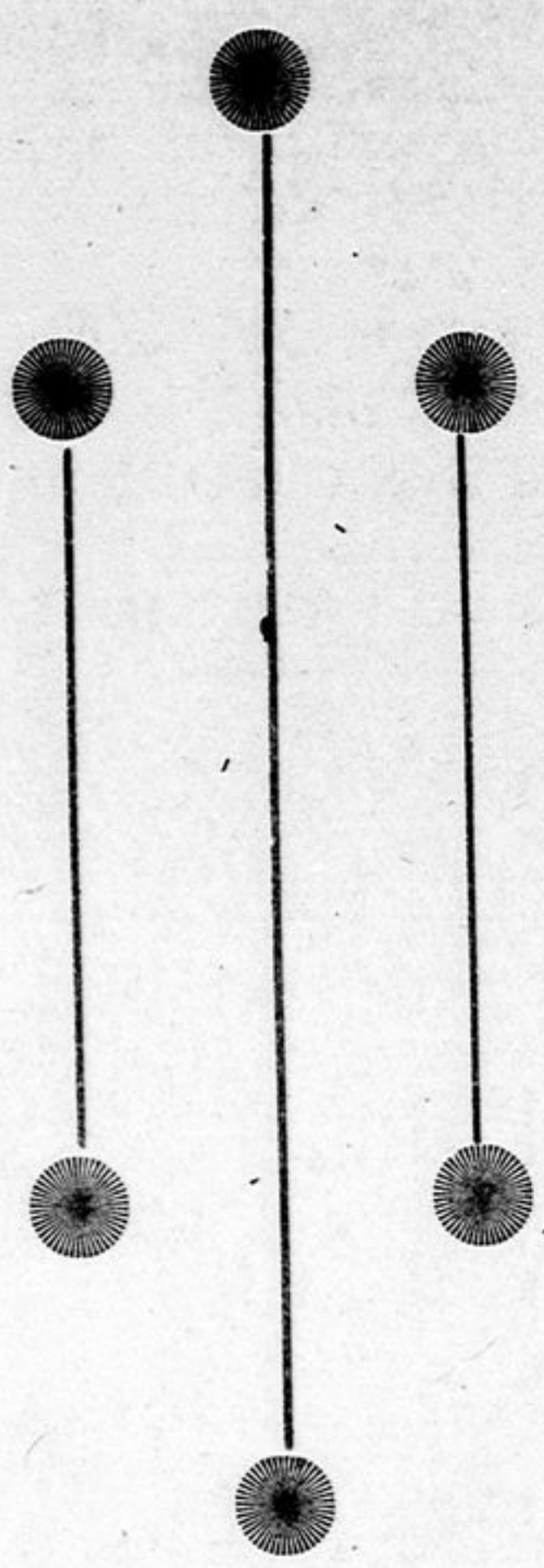

FOUNDER OF THE WALKERTON TELESCOPE IS DEAD.

Mr. Donald Wilson Ross, who died yesterday at his residence, 16 Russell street, was a native of the county of Oxford, where he was born in 1832. The people of that county were even then noted for the steadfastness of their Liberalism in politics, and their abounding faith in the value of scholastic education. Mr. Ross, after the completion of his early education, took the Arts course in the University of Toronto, from which he graduated in 1860 with a bias for linguistic study that increased with advancing years, even to the end of his life. After the usual course in the Law Society he was called to the Bar, and he settled down to practice in Kincardine, then the most important village in the comparatively new county of Bruce.

In 1868 he was appointed Crown Attorney, which necessitated his removal to Walkerton, the county town. For half a dozen years he was engaged in developing local jurisprudence in a new settlement, but in 1874 he threw up the Crown office in order to become a candidate for Parliament in South Bruce. A few years earlier he had manifested his fondness for politics by establishing a weekly newspaper in Walkerton, then and still called The Telescope. For several years after his retirement into private life he lived at Windsor, but he spent the last fifteen years in Toronto, giving his whole time to somewhat severe literary and philological toil.

Mr. Ross is survived by three sons and a daughter, the last-named, Miss Lottie, one of Toronto's successful public school teachers. The sons are H. F. M. Ross, of Winnipeg, and O. M. Ross and Victor Ross, all three well-known journalists.—The Globe, Mar. 17.
