SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH WEST LAND REGULATIONS

THE sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at the office of any Local Agent of Dominion Lands (not sub-agent), on certain conditions.

Duties.—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required in every case, except when residence is performed in the vicinity.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$3 per acre. Duties.—Six months residence in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and 50 acres extra cultivation.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price, \$3 per acre. Duties.—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 50 acres and erect a house worth \$300.

The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, scrubby or stony land.

Lindsay—McMillan—That the Municipal World be paid \$6.56 for office supplies for clerk.—Carried.

McMillan—Peart—That the Farmers' Club have the use of the hall for their meetings of 1914 at \$6.—C. Lindsay—McMillan—That Robert McGillivray be paid \$3.50 for work with team at lot 6, con. 3, N.D.R.—Carried.

Peart—Lindsay—That the assessor be paid \$50 on salary.—Carried. Lindsay—McMillan—That Emerson Peart be paid \$1 for work with team hauling plank.—Carried.

McMillan—Young—That Arthur Greenwood be refunded \$5.51 being on account of an error on Roll 1912.—Carried.
