Lesson VI.—Second Quarter, For May 10, 1914.

THE INTERNATIONAL SERIES.

Text of the Lesson, Luke xvi, 1-13. Memory Verses, 8, 9—Golden Text, Luke xvi, 10—Commentary Prepared by Rev. D. M. Stearns.

Our last lesson was concerning a young man who wasted his father's substance in riotous living (Luke xv, 13). Now we read of a steward who wasted his master's goods.

We are all stewards of Him who giveth us life and breath and all things; in whom we live and move and have our being; in whose hand our breath is and whose are all our ways; who giveth richly all things to enjoy.

Money is not necessarily evil, but it is written, "The love of money is the root of all evil," and it is better to follow after righteousness, godliness, faith, love, patience, meekness (1 Tim. vi, 10, 11). This present world or age is evil, it lieth in the wicked one, the devil is its god, its friendship is enmity with God, we are not to be conformed to it, for we are not of it.

HOUSEHOLD HELPS

French fried potatoes dipped in egg before frying are delicious. Place a large sponge in the bottom of the umbrella jar if you would not break it.

Unbleached muslin shrinks very much when washing. When making it up an extra inch a yard should be allowed for this.

To set growing house plants in the bath tub and spray them with a bath spray is one of the best methods of giving their leaves the necessary moisture.

Overalls and such heavy articles should be dipped in the tub of water, then laid on the washboard, and scrubbed with a scrubbing brush.

Seeds not sufficiently ripe will float in water, but when arrived at full maturity they will sink to the bottom, and this is proof that they are good to plant.

Brushes and brooms used for cleaning purposes will be kept in much better condition if they are always hung up, if the handles are not provided with hooks for hanging, insert in the end of each handle a screw eye.

To prevent fruit from sinking to the bottom of a cake, put raisins and currants in a dish and set it on the back of the stove; stir them occasionally and see that they do not burn. When thoroughly heated, add them to the batter.
