THE sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old may homestead a quarter-section of evailable Dominion land in Maninours, 8 to 10 a. m. to 4 p. m. and 7 to 9 toba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at the office of any Local Agent of Dominion Lands (not

sub-agent), on certain conditions, Duties.-Six months residence apon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions.
