GERMAN'S NEW HARBOR.

As showing the state of feeling in Europe before the sudden outbreak of the war, the following is reprinted from the London Dispatch of July 26:

Germany has got 135 miles nearer to Great Britain. Such is the effect of the purchase of a harbor near Rotterdam by the Vulkan Shipbuilding Company, which is owned by Herr Thyssen, the multi-millionaire, whose projects are invariably supported indirectly by the State, as are those of the firm of Krupp.

The point at which the harbor is to be built is at Vlaardingen, only 115 miles distant from Harwich, and a shorter distance from the Suffolk coast. It will be 20 miles nearer to England than Antwerp, of which Napoleon once said that, in the hands of a strong sea power, it was a pistol presented at England's head.

The nearest German port to British territory at the present time is Emden, which is slightly over 250 miles from the Norfolk coast.

The Vulkan Company has constructed German dreadnaughts in its shipbuilding yards at Stettin and Hamburg.

The new port will be available for ships of the largest size and will contain a coaling station and repairing yard. In the hands of the German navy it would serve as an invaluable base.

Germany has recently brought extreme pressure to bear upon the Dutch Government, not only to secure this concession, but also to obtain the construction by the Dutch of fortifications at Flushing, barring the waterway to Antwerp.

A report which is believed to be true has been received at Grimsby that Mr. Albert Kiesel, formerly a leading jeweller in Grimsby, who returned to Germany a few years ago and went to reside in Berlin, has been shot for refusing to fight against Britain.
