SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

The sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan, or Alberta.

Duties.—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead.

A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre.
