BRING BACK THE QUAIL

Encourage this Splendid Game Bird on the Farm.

How We Lost Our Quail — Most Birds Are Friends of Farmers—Quail Destroy Weed Seeds and Insects—How to Entice Them Back.

(Contributed by Ontario Department of Agriculture, Toronto.)

Why not have lots of quail? When they were plentiful we had a great deal of first-class gunning. By gunning overmuch and not protecting them in the winter, we have almost lost the Bob-White of our boyhood.

How We Lost the Quail.

In the old days the farm boy shot a few brace of quail. The city sport came out, and a few brace were not enough for him.

The brush heaps, natural shelter for the quail, were cleared up and burned. Every foot of ground was cleared for the plough or for pasture.

Most Birds Are the Farmers' Friends.

The question is, do you wish them back? I believe you will when you give it a little thought. You, to-day, are fighting an uphill fight against insects and weeds.

Let us very briefly take up the general question of loss from insects and noxious weeds, and in this connection show what the birds we now have are doing.

To give a concrete example: It is estimated that the State of Massachusetts, with an area of 8,000 square miles, has not less than five wild birds to the acre, or a bird population of 25,600,000.

One-half of the quail's food consists of weed seeds, one-fourth of grain, mostly taken from the stubble, and about fifteen per cent. of insects.

Quail Destroy Weed Seeds and Insects.

Now comes the question of again having these birds plentiful. It cannot be done in a day, nor must you expect it in a year.

There are some quail left. There may be a few on your farm. Protect them. They are worth gold dollars to you.

How to Entice the Quail Back.

Place heaps of brush in the fence corners. Plant a Virginia Creeper, or Wild Cucumber seed, and instead of a brush heap, it will become a beauty spot.

In the spring, sow some buckwheat and rye in the fence corners, around your shelters.

Here and There

Vancouver as a grain port has gone over the top and is assured of achieving the 15,000,000 bushel objective set for the 1922-1923 crop year.

A Canadian Pacific Railway train, over half a mile long, left Oshawa for New York recently. The train was composed of 52 flat cars, each carrying from four to six automobiles.

Making the heaviest loading since the big crop year of 1915, grain loaded on the western lines of the Canadian Pacific Railway from September 1st, 1922, to March 7th, 1923, inclusive, totalled 118,565 cars.

While in mid Pacific, the wireless operator of the Canadian Pacific Steamship "Empress of Russia" was in touch with the Leafield wireless station in England.

An Owen Sound deputation which recently interviewed Canadian Pacific Railway officials in Toronto, urged the building of a line from Owen Sound, through Meaford and on to Collingwood and then on to a point on the Sudbury line near Coldwater.

Captain A. J. Hesken, R.N.R., of the Canadian Pacific Steamer "Empress of Russia," has been awarded the Medaille d'Honneur de Sauvegarde de premiere classe by the French Government.

There is a gold rush on to Rouyn township, in northern Quebec, to Labrador and now to the Soo district. In fact, the whole northern district has immense areas of rock bearing more or less gold.

Still another case of children travelling alone. Elmer Lann, five years old, and Roland Callwell, seven years old, both living on St. Denis street, Montreal, were missed by their parents who did not hear of them after their disappearance until notified by Canadian Pacific Railway officials that the children were in Quebec city.

The initial shipment of cattle since the Embargo removal was recently inspected by the Hon. W. P. Motherwell, Minister of Agriculture, in the C. P. R. stock yards, Montreal.

It has remained for the Canadian Pacific experimental farm at Strathmore to demonstrate beyond the possible shadow of doubt that the expensive trench silo system of providing winter fodder for cattle is, under favorable conditions, quite equal to the costly structures which have in the past been utilized and that the silage is in every sense excellent.

PROVINCIAL AND COUNTY ROADWORK FOR THIS YEAR

Grey County road construction units will be distributed on practically the same roads as last year, with the exception of the unit under George Hill which last year was engaged in construction work on the Meaford Road.

Each of the units have a maximum of about \$20,000 to spend and this will not permit of any great amount of construction work being done by any one gang.

The contract for the construction of the balance of the Provincial Highway north of Chatsworth to the end of the part of the road already under contract, has been let to the Frank Milligan Construction Company, the same firm that has the contract for the portion already constructed and under construction.

The statement has been made that this year the part of the roadway built on the Garafraxa would be oiled or tarred and that next year the probability is that it would be paved.
