**ONTARIO'S NEW MOTOR LAWS**

Following are the principal features of the Consolidated Motor Vehicles Act, which is now before the Ontario Legislature and which is expected to go into effect practically as it stands, except for some minor amendments:

The re-drafted regulation in respect to lamps provides for two white lights forward and one rear light astern, and no motor vehicle is permitted to carry on the front more than three lighted lamps of over four candlepower. Any additional lights displayed on commercial vehicles to distinguish the width or class of such vehicles, shall be of green color.

The clause governing the use of parking lights is as follows: "A motor vehicle may show one light carried on the left side..... in such manner as to be clearly visible to the front and rear for at least 200 feet, and to show white to the front and red to the rear, provided that such light shall not be displayed while the vehicle is in motion."

The new penalties provided for car owners or drivers who operate

machines on which the brakes are not in good order are from \$10 to \$50 for the first offence and from \$20 to \$100 for the second offence, and from \$50 to \$200 for the third offence. The license of a second offender may be suspended for thirty days. One who offends three or more times may have his license suspended for six months and may also be condemned to jail for 30 days. For failure to have and use a warning signal, penalties of \$5 to \$10 and \$10 to \$25 are provided for first, second and third offence, respectively, and in addition the license of an offender for the third time may be suspended for 60 days.

The amended section governing speed in cities, towns and villages, provides a limit of 20 miles per hour, 10 miles per hour when approaching an intersecting road in a municipal and 12½ miles an hour when approaching an intersecting road, a curve, or a "blind" section.

The following penalties are provided for infringements of the speed laws: \$5 to \$50 fine for the first offence, \$10 to \$75 for a second offence,

and \$25 to \$100, with imprisonment up to 30 days, for a third offence. In addition, the license of an offender for the second time may be suspended for 30 days, and that of a party guilty of a third offence may be suspended for six months. On highways without any municipal lights, a speed of 25 miles is prescribed. Where the rate of speed does not exceed 35 miles, the following penalties are provided: \$5 to \$10 for first offence, \$10 to \$25 for second offence, and \$25 to \$50 for subsequent offences. On a third offence a license may be suspended for 60 days. Where the rate of speed complained of is between 35 and 40 miles per hour, the following penalties are provided: \$10 to \$50 for first offence, \$20 to \$100 for second offence, and \$50 to \$200, with or without imprisonment up to 30 days, for a third offence. It is also provided that for second offence a license may be suspended for 30 days, and on a third offence for six months. Where the rate of speed is in excess of 40 miles per hour, the penalty is: \$25 to \$100 fine, with or without imprisonment

up to six months, and suspension of license for a period up to one year. Penalties provided for violation of rules of the road are: \$5 to \$10 for first offence, \$10 to \$25 for second offence, and \$25 to \$50 for a third offence. On third offence a license may be suspended for not more than sixty days.

The onus of proof still rests upon the motorist under this revised Act. That is, to say that he was not responsible for an accident instead of the plaintiff being required to prove that the motorist was responsible.

**STUDY THE WEATHER**

Weather is always an interesting subject, especially to the farmer, and there are certain signs which, with a good deal of accuracy, forecast what the weather will be during the next twenty-four hours. A few of these are given below:

If the early morning is cloudy but as it goes on the clouds begin to disperse, a fine day is in prospect.

If the morning is hazy and the sun is seen through a mist, but the sky

appears blue, the day will most likely be warm.

A red sunset usually means fine weather for the next day.

A yellow sunset means a wet day to follow.

A red sunrise with lowering clouds in the morning indicates rain.

When the stars seem particularly bright at night and twinkle more plainly than usual, a wet day usually follows.

A ring around the moon indicates considerable moisture in the atmosphere, and if the ring grows smaller, approaching rain.

If the ring grows larger, however, it indicates fair weather.

Morning fogs are omens of settled weather and a morning fog usually breaks away before noon.
