SYNOPSIS OF PROPOSED BY-LAW OF MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF DURHAM.

To guarantee debentures of the Durham Red Cross Memorial Hospital to the amount of \$10,000.00 for erecting and equipping an addition to the said Hospital. The Debentures to bear interest at the rate of five per centum per annum and be repayable in thirty equal annual payments with interest, such payments not to exceed \$650.51 annually.

Take notice that the foregoing is a true synopsis of a proposed By-Law of the corporation of the Town of Durham to be submitted to the votes of the electors on the Thirtieth day of July, A. D. 1928, between the hours of nine o'clock in the forenoon and five o'clock in the afternoon at the following places:

The North Ward at the Public Library.

The East Ward at A. MacFarlane's Shop.

The West Ward at the Town Hall.

And that the Twenty-eighth day of July A.D. 1928 at ten o'clock in the forenoon at the Town Clerk's Office in the said Municipality has been fixed for the appointment of persons to attend at the polling places, and at the final summing up of the votes by the Clerk.

And that if the assent of the electors is obtained to the said proposed By-Law it will be taken into consideration by the Municipal Council of the said Corporation at a meeting thereof to be held after the expiration of one month from the date of the first publication of this notice, and that such first publication was made on the Fifth day of July, A. D. 1928.
