Members of the Horticultural Society, having suffered from its existence and while not wishing to be officious by those whose attention was directed to the pest, and not desiring to invoke the law-penalty \$20 fine, and costs, have appointed an Inspector.

Will every person having plum trees or cherry trees please examine them closely removing and burning all Black Knot found. The leaves having fallen, the work can be easily done and now is the time. It is during the rains of winter and spring that the spores are liberated, wafted hither and thither by the wind till falling on plum or cherry trees they grow.
