She told me that she was not getting enough support for the children from Mr. Queen who had been guardian of the children, I know that Queen has been discharged from guardanship over a year ago and that the money has been stopped since that time. Mrs. Lindle came to me a year getting sufficent then to support her and the children. From my knowledge of Mrs. Lindle's surroundings she has nothing to support either herself or children at the present time.

I visited the house of Mrs. Lindle on Wednesday last and found the said Mrs. Lindle and the children Ada Maud Hill and Olive Lindle in a wretched condition in rags and filth. The children were hungry, had nothing for breakfast and there was no food in the house. There was a very little fire and no wood except a handful of wet bark. Mrs. Lindle said she had nothing and had received nothing only a little bread the previous Saturday. She said she had no means of support unless what came from Queen and that Queen made improper relationships with her for what she got. That he had connection with her since the hearing in Ayton, Finding this condition of affairs I had the children arrested and removed, and would now ask that they be committed to the care of the Children's Aid Society of Owen Sound.


