

A few good feeders were reported as selling at from \$3.25 to \$3.62½ per cwt. Shipping bulls are worth from \$3.25 2 00 to \$3.50 per cwt; light bulls all the way

from \$2,25 to \$3 per cwt. Ordinary butcher cattle were firm at from 3½ to 4c per lb,, and a few lots sold at 4½c per lb; medium sold at from 3½ to 3½c per pound; common at 3 to 3½c, and inferior at 2¾ to 3c per pound. The market could not be considered a good one for common cattle.

A few good milk cows are in demand at from \$40 to \$50 each; second and moderate cows fetch from \$25 to \$35 each Sheep and lambs are in sufficient sup-ply and steady demand at unchanged 10 00 prices from yesterday and Tuesday.
