Live Stock Markets.

TORONTO.

The market here this morning was a fairly brisk one, but scarcely as large as had been expected; the receipts only amounted to 45 loads, but we had ample stuff of all kinds for our business requirements. There was some good useful Christmas cattle here, which found a ready sale at firm prices. There was no quotable change from yesterday for either cattle, small stuff, or hogs, and for the commoner grades of cattle the demand was slow and sales dragged though ultimately everything on the market sold.

Shipping cattle were being purchased freely at from \$4 to \$4.50 and occasionally \$4.00 per cwt
