THE LATE NEIL McDONALD.

BY PRICEVILLE CORRESPONDENT. We find it again our painful duty to

chronicle the death of another near and dear friend in the person of Neil Mc-Donald, who departed this life on Sunday night, 5th inst. at ten o'clock, aged 61 years and 5 months.

Born on the 8th concession, township BRITISH of Vaughan, on the 15th September, 1837, he came to the township of Glenelg on the 1st May, 1851, being three months later than the rest of the family. Being the oldest of the family the lot fell on him to remain to feed and take care of the stock till spring. when with his father, the late Arch'd McDonald, who went back in the spring to undertake the task of moving the live stock and such implements as were in use at the time. They started the journey on Monday morning enroute by way of Fergus with a yoke of oxen and wagon loaded with implements, etc., arriving at Durham about dark on load in Hunter's stables, which stood exactly where the large and commodious Review office now stands, and unyoking the oxen drove to their home in the woods on lot 41, Durham Road, Glenelg, arriving about twelve o'clock at night footsore, weary and hungry where they found the family patiently awaiting their arrival to their humble dwelling. The subject of our sketch, who was entering on his use the axe with much freedom in as sisting his father in hewing out a home in the forest for a helpless family.

Mr. McDonald was married on the Alaska, at Douglass City; two daughters at home, Christina and Mary Ann, and a lonesome mother which are all that constitutes the family at present.

Mr. McDonafd's ailment, spinal disease, commenced years ago, but was not disabled till the 15th of September last when he became almost completely paralyzed. He received the best of attention and care from his beloved partner and his ever faithful daughters during his illness, but "friends nor physician could not save this mortal body from the grave."

Mr. McDonald and family made their home for fifteen years on lot 20, con. 21, Egremont, now the property of Mr. Allan McKinnon, of Ducham.
