The receipts amounted to \$252,344,30 an increase as compared with 1897 of \$2.404,69. Owing to the low death rate there was a decrease in the amount paid out of \$8.415. 47. The net result was to add to the surplus the sum of \$108,407.24, the largest addition in the Order's history, making a net surplus at the close of the year of \$701,173,75, which amount with the exception of \$73,751,08 deposited on current account, is invested as follows: Dominion Government Stock \$100,000, 00, Loan Co. Debentures \$270,000,00, Municipal Debentures \$142,422,67, and Bank Deposits \$125,000,00.

The total amount of Insurance carried by the Order at the close of year was \$31.727.500,00 an increase for the year of \$3.451.000,00. There were 1,327 carrying \$500.00 insurance: 27.830 carrying \$1.-000; 60 carrying \$1,500, and 1572 carrying \$2,000. The average amount at risk was \$1,030,48 as against \$1040,91 a
