BY-LAW NO. 354

A BY-LAW to aid and assist "The Durham Furniture Company, Limited," in building and operating a Furniture Factory in the Town of Durham.

WHEREAS, a joint stock company has been organized in the Town of Durham, known as "The Durham Furniture Company, Limited," for the purpose of manufacturing furniture in the Town of Durham; and whereas the said Company is desirous of building a Factory and of having the same completed and in running order during the year 1899; and whereas the Company has applied to the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Town of Durham for aid by way of loan, of the sum of \$10,000, to the Company, in accordance with the terms of an agreement herein after referred to.

And WHEREAS, it is deemed expedient and desirable, to loan the said sum of \$10,000, to the said Company for said purpose.

And WHEREAS, the amount of the whole rateable property of the said Town of Durham, according to the last revised Assessment Roll thereof, being the Assessment Roll for the year 1898, is \$300,732.

And WHEREAS, the existing Debenture debt of the said Town of Durtion, and the Council before committing build up the system and take lending at 5 per cent. and on large loans at 48-4. ham amounts to the sum of \$21,128. No principal and no interest being themselves, called a public meeting in arrears.

THEREFORE, the Corporation of the Town of Durham, by the Council thereof, enacts as follows:

1. It shall and may be lawful for the Municipal Council of the said Corporation of the Town of Durham to aid the said "The Durham Furniture the Company, Limited," in the erection and completion of a Factory, for the manufacture of Furniture within the limits of the said Corporation, by lending the said Company the sum of \$10,000, repayable without interest in eight consecutive annual instalments, the first seven of \$1,000 each, at the ends of the third, fourth, fifth, sixth, seventh, eighth and muth years, and a final instalment of \$3,000 at the end of the tenth year, in accordance with the terms of an agreement to be entered into between the said "The Durham Furniture Company Limited, and the Corporation of the Town of Durham,
