OUR OTTAWA LETTER.

Empire Day

The celebration of the Queen's Birthday this year will be made specially memorable in at least three Provinces of the Dominion by the fact that for the first time, the day preceeding it will be recognized and observed as "Empire Day." "Empire Day" is to be particularly a school children's demonstration. The idea of instituting it originated with Hon. G. W. Ross, Ontario's Minister of Education, who proposes that the forenoon of the anniversary be devoted to a talk by the teacher upon the British Empire, its extent and resources, the relation of Canada to the Empire, the unity of the Empire and its advantages, the privileges which, as British subjects, we enjoy, the extent of Canada and its resources, readings from Canadian and British authors, interesting historical incidents in connection with our own country, — the aim of the teacher in all his references to Canada and the Empire being, to make Canadian patriotism intelligent, comprehensive and strong. In the afternoon it is suggested that a school entertainment be given, the program consisting of patriotic songs, readings and recitations by the pupils, and speeches by trustees, clergymen and others.

The idea has been enthusiastically taken up in Ontario, Quebec and Nova Scotia, and there is good reason to believe that it will spread to the other Provinces, indeed it is not unreasonable to anticipate that it will eventually find favor in other parts of the Empire.
