SOUTH GREY SHOW.

Lots of Entries in Cold Weather.

To-day, Tuesday, the 25th Annual Show of South Grey Agricultural Society was opened and for a few hours before and after noon the approach to the Hall was a bustling scene.

The entries this year are more numerous than ever we believe, but still the Hall, though having a creditable display looks a little slim. The absence of some of the big vegetable "collections" may be the cause.

True to its past, the flower display is an excellent one, though frosts of late have no doubt injured it much. Over-rides Mrs. MacKenzie's name from the list this year and her flowers from the stand. S. Arrowsmith takes about 20 firsts and Mr. Gorsline not far, if any, behind. Hugh McDonald cuts a swath amongst flowers and plant exhibitors this year with some fine specimens, and Nat Harvey's taste is again in evidence.

A number of classes of ladies' work is vacant this year. Mrs. Ahrens is an extensive prize winner, not being well her exhibit is in charge of Miss Messenger, who naturally was well pleased with her success.

Mrs. Wm. Mountain captured the first prize for home made bread. About a dozen entries, and all of it looked "good." This is a much valued prize as it should be.

J. L. Browne has the only collection of photos, and as usual there is some beautiful work. In the Fine Art class Mrs. J. D. Roberts (nee Miss M. Main) shows her skill and taste again, and the judges found it no easy task to place the honors.

The fruit shows well, potatoes a little off in quality. Wheat, we have seen a better display, but the coarse grains are excellent, especially peas.

Mr. F. Lenahan has a fine display of Cabinetware which makes a cozy "corner" down stairs.

The Directors must be satisfied they built the addition for the poultry men, seeing the well filled condition of the building. And still the cry is for more room. "We have the best poultry show within 50 miles," is one man's opinion. Judge Wright, of Owen Sound, pays them a high compliment; not only are they ahead of any other local show, they are, he says, fit to appear anywhere. Our local fanciers, Brown, Moore, Leavens, Holt, Harvey, Knapp, Lang and a few others put up a splendid show and deserve credit.

Heartly thanks are due to Secretary Davidson, and to Messrs. D. Edge and Alex. Binnie for assistance in securing the prize list. Caretaker Anderson did very wrong in allowing two shivering editors to secure the prize list from the tickets on the pastry, raspberry wine, etc. Had it not been there was good company near them, how they might have fallen!

SECOND DAY.

Again fortune favored South Grey's big day with fine weather which never fails to draw a crowd.

After all, seeing each other is the main object of the many. The few attend to the roots, the flowers, the stock, the butter and the braiding. The horses never fail to maintain attention, and the hillside crowded begins to melt when the racing interest is over.

The verdict of old timers is that the hall is not up to its usual standard, that poultry show is immense, that the crowd was larger than ever, that the track was never in better condition, and that the crowd never was happier.

Lenahan's home like corner in cabinetware was much admired. McKinnon's exhibit of sewing machines pinions and organs was a centre of attraction all afternoon. Livingstone had a reasonable stove exhibit and sewing machines, while upstairs, Smith shows some fine robes tanned by his famous new process.

Outside Calder had a striking and, for the weather, appropriate display of robes. Besides he had quite a fine show of vehicles, ploughs &c.

R. P. Legate, of the Soho Foundry, Ceylon had a few articles of his own manufacture. These were wheelbarrow, scuffer, plough, pulper and turnip seeder. Livingstone was also in evidence with ploughs and other implements. C. McKinnon's display consisted of waggons, cutters, pulpers, &c.

The Fine Arts department needs attention. The artists who exhibit their

fine work should be treated to a better position as regards light, and should have a better background than a hemlock board. The hanging committee should give this consideration.

In the speeding contest there was some pretty work. Caldwell's Black Diamond came in 1st in the first heat, but in the 3 following heats J. A. Hunter's Blackthorn, R. Scott driving, had things his own way getting first money. Diamond got 2nd money while A. Grierson's speedy little whiteface was a good third.

Cattle were scarcer than usual: A S Hunter's fine Herefords won much admiration. As will be seen in L. Dixon, a new man, walked right in and took first prize for Ayrshire bull over such breeders as Caldwell's, S. F. Reiner had some good Durhams his two bull calves winning 1st and 2nd through Mr. R. differs from the judges and holds the 2nd prize one, worth \$103, placing the other at \$80.

W. Herd scooped in 5 firsts in sheep, and three seconds and has won laurels with his Leicesters in Hanover and walkerton. Mrs. Herd got the coveted 1st for tub butter, and is an extensive winner in several lines. A Muir, Ceylon and H. Brigham, Allan Park got their share of prizes.

The little boy and the young man with his best girl voted the day a failure owing to the lack of both. Strange omission! not even a candy stand to sweeten the thousands, who is to blame?

With such a warm support the Directors another year should get some special attraction by way of entertainment.
