WHAT IT MEANS TO START A BLAST FURNACE

Few people who have not actually run a blast furnace, realize what it means to fill the capacious maw of one of these monsters. A stock of 200 tons daily of raw materials, which is 10 per cent. over, must be delivered to it each day something more than 400 tons of ore, 250 to 300 tons of coke, and over 100 tons of limestone, besides sand, coal and minor supplies. The mining of iron requires the labor of 150 to 300 men. The smelting, coke making, quarrying of limestone and transportation, at least 300 more. The furnace itself employs about 100 men. Starting up a furnace of ordinary capacity, therefore, calls immediately for the use of at least a thousand rail-roads, and many locomotives; for perhaps seven steamers; for 200 cars on the lakes; for 2000 men on the mines to the pig iron, of one to two millions of dollars, and last, but not least, for a large order of managing ability.
