## FIRST TRIAL UNDER NEW LAW.

Japanese laws methods have lately acquired a very practical interest for foreigners. In the days of the old treaties a glimpse the Tokko appeal court was merely exhausting the usual weary round of temples, teahouses and theatres. PRESIDENT CONTROLS IT. Almost the whole of the examination is in the hands of the President. The har has a very subordinate part. Barristers limit themselves to suggesting questions and making applications they do not themselves examine witnesses; all questions are put through the presiding judge. The propriety of any query the latter may think fit to put is apparently never questioned, the Japanese barrister appearing to be very much less pugnacious and much more overawed by the court than his British confrere. Less time is probably wasted than in an English court, but there is no question as to which system is the more fair to the prisoner.

Lastly, the judgment itself is a curiosity. If this case be any criterion, the President of the court is at least as anxious as the procurator to exhibit his literary powers. # Best Way to Clean Marble.




