DR. LANDERKIN AT GUELPH.

At a Liberal meeting in Guelph last week in support of the candidature of Mr. Guthrie for S. Wellington, Dr. Landerkin was a speaker, and is thus reported in the Mercury:

Dr. Landerkin said it was a high honor indeed, for such a young man as Mr. Guthrie to be selected as the standard-bearer for the Liberals of South Wellington, and for such an honorable and upright leader as Sir Wilfrid Laurier. Sir Wilfrid was not only that but a statesman, and he was redeeming plank by plank the Liberal platform laid down at Ottawa in 1893. The speaker then referred to the commercial policy of the Government and the prosperity of the country has enjoyed since the present Government has come into power. He contrasted the position of Guelph four years ago with the prosperity of to-day. Their business then was dull; now he observed shops were running at night and the men were receiving higher wages than before. The preferential tariff, he said, was a relief that gave relief and did not oppress. The Gerry-mander Act of 1892 and amended in 1892 was for the purpose of keeping the Conservative party in power. The Liberals had been relieving the burdens of the people since coming into power, and the trade of Canada was now double what it was three years ago. He did not attribute all the present prosperity to the policy of the Government, but he attributed a certain amount of it. The Government was thoroughly Canadian and British. Canada was first to offer their assistance and send a contingent of troops to South Africa. In conclusion he hoped the defeat sustained three years ago would be reversed at the next election, and he was sure that would be the case.

Farmers beware of your stock. For about the past two years several thefts have been made, chiefly in stock, a short distance north of Holstein.
